



## DreamWeavers Leadership Path

*Project DreamCatchers (Early Intervention)* rely on a network of volunteers that we call our DreamWeavers. Our volunteers come from all parts of our state to make a difference for children and families in their community. They share their experiences and provide support to families that help them become life long advocates for their child. Our volunteers share their stories, advocate, and network to provide resources that will help each family in their journey. Our staff mentors volunteers through training, mailings and phone conferences. DreamWeavers are held to the highest standards of integrity in their volunteer efforts.

The leadership path below offers many opportunities to make a difference by learning new information and sharing it with others. Each DreamWeaver makes a personal choice to stay at a level or move through the path in a way that works best for them.

### Level 1

- Attend foundation workshops (PRO 101, FLECHA and/or P2P, Telling Your Story)
- Share general information by completing a Parents Reaching Out Volunteer Application
- Distribute information about Parents Reaching Out in your community
- Join our volunteer E-list serve to keep informed on current topics/events
- Assist with PRO Information Booths to tell other parents about resources in your community, passing our fliers about upcoming PRO trainings and other information
- Offer basic assistance through a P2P match to help parents discover their Dream for their child
- Encourage local EI agencies to provide parent trainings

### Level 2

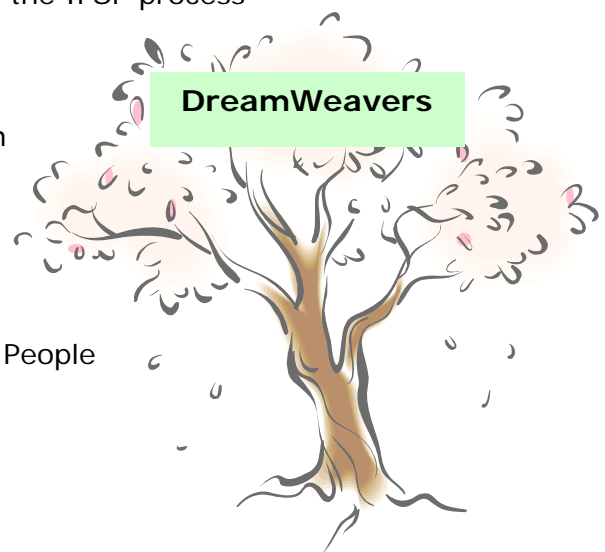
- Attend the Grab-n-Go/Keeping It All Together workshop
- Attend the Develop the Dream workshop to learn about the IFSP process
- Assist and support other families through:
  - o Phone Calls
  - o E-mail and/or Letters
  - o Basic assistance/support in a Parent to Parent Match

### Level 3

- Attend FFHIC, FAF, DC & PIRC workshops
- Host PRO Information Booths
- Co-present basic workshops
- Provide support to a family in building their story using People First Language and skills learned in Telling Your Story

### Level 4

- Get involved in legislative issues
- Present workshops w/assistance from PRO staff
- Serve on the DreamCatchers Advisory
- Share parent perspective to build capacity of the Early Intervention System (parent panels, etc.)
